Deborah Denenholz Morse is a Professor of English at the College of William and Mary, and the author of numerous books and essays on the novels of Anthony Trollope and other Victorian literary topics. Her books include *The Politics of Gender in Anthony Trollope's Novels: New Readings for the Twenty-First Century* (ed. with Margaret Markwick and Regenia Gagnier); *Women in Trollope's Palliser Novels*; and the forthcoming *Reforming Trollope: History and Englishness in the Novels of Anthony Trollope*.
